# PROGRAM: NOTES FROM THE BORDER

Jane Greiling had led her life in rather conventional ways until...she volunteered at Annunciation House in El Paso Texas. Annunciation House is a shelter with the mission of assisting newly arrived asylum seekers move on to their U.S. sponsors. Jane's presentation includes stories and photos of life in the El Paso, Texas shelter as she recorded it in her 6 years of intermittently volunteering there.

Jane has resided in Rochester for 14 years. She is a retired nurse, ending her nursing career at Mayo Clinic. Most of Jane's nursing career was at a rural community hospital in Richland Center, WI, where she was a nurse manager and worked in hospice. Jane has found time to volunteer in Family Promise and the Warming Center, as well as being a mentor with the Intercultural Mutual Assistance Association.

# **ERA UPDATE**

\* MN STATE ERA BILLS SF37 / HF173 proposes an Amendment to the MN Constitution guaranteeing legal equality for all people. Chief authors: Senator Mary Kunesh & Representative Kaohly Her. HF173 needs to pass House Rules Cmte chaired by Rep Jamie Long before going to floor vote. SF37 is ready for Senate floor vote.

\* MN BILLS - RESOLUTION SF47 / HF197 calls for Congress to affirm that the Federal Equal Rights Amendment is valid and is the 28th Amendment. Chief authors: Senator Sandy Pappas & Representative Kristin Bahner. Both Bills are ready for a floor vote. Similar resolutions have been passed in CA, HI, MI, CO.

Why is it important to pass ERA Bills in 2023? So there is adequate time to educate the public on the amendment prior to voting on the general ballot in 2024 Learn more at: https://eramn.org/2023-minnesota-federal-era-resolution/
