LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS-ROCHESTER STATUES FOR EQUALITY & HOLIDAY COFFEE

Saturday, December 9 from 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 p.m.

Enjoy a variety of holiday baked goods and coffee, socialize with LWV members and supporters, and get to know Amelia Witherstine and the Statues for Equality Project.

Who is Amelia Witherstine and why would we want a statue of her in Rochester?

Born in 1861, Amelia Witherstine was the first woman elected to the Rochester School Board and a Women's Suffrage Amendment supporter. Guest speakers, Judy Hickey and Virginia Wright-Peterson, will share more about the effort to recognize this woman of importance in Rochester's history with a local statue. Statues For Equality is an international project created by sculpture artists Gillie and Marc with a purpose to increase the representation of women in statuary throughout the world.

Judy Hickey is executive director for the Greater Rochester Arts & Cultural Trust. Virginia Wright-Peterson is a local author and is providing historical research for the project. Together they will provide a fascinating look into our local history, the life of Amelia Witherstine, and why it's important to finally honor women in this public way.


