

On a more positive note, the AAUW scholarship for a female UMR student has reached \$33,893 as of July 31. This means that we can award this scholarship for the 2025-26 school year. In the spring, several of our board members will be meeting with Lindsey Hemker, Director of Development and Alumni Relations at UMR, to finalize the criteria for the scholarship.
